VERSE 2

[G] I watch the birds **[Em]** fly south across the

[D] Now you're not **[G]** here

CHORUS

OUTRO

Ukulele Tips: Chords: **G, Em, C, Am, D, Bm** – lush and melancholy, but easy transitions.

Strumming: slow **down-down-up-up-down-up** or fingerpick **4-3-2-1** for softness.


Tempo around 70 bpm — let each chord breathe before moving.

Accent emotional lines like “Now you’re not here” by letting them hang slightly longer.


For dynamics, play verses softly and build slightly into the chorus, then fade to a whisper on the outro.

End with an open **G**, letting it ring into silence like the final leaf falling.


